## Year 7 Literacy & Numeracy Catch Up funding for 2017/2018

Allocated £5,077 for 2017/2018 financial year.

This has been used to support the delivery and resourcing of Read Write Inc.

RWI resources were bought specifically to deliver this programme, totalling  $\pounds 2,752$  and staff completed RWI training, totalling  $\pounds 1,300$ .

11 pupils in Year 7
2 out of 11 (18%) are female
5 out of 11 (46%) are new to school
6 out of 11 (54%) were already at White Spire

RWI assessment

- 5 out of 11 (46%) have moved from Blue group to Grey groups (highest group)
- 1 out of 11 (9%) has remained in Language and Literacy group (post RWI)
- 1 out of 11 (9%) has moved group making progress in sound acquisition however remains in low group
- 4 out of 11 (36%) have moved up by one group which is in line with expectations

In 2017/18 Maths was identified as an area needing support and training. All teaching staff, both teachers and TAs involved in the teaching of maths have received 2 hours of training in Numicon from the MK Council Numicon specialist.

Maths resources were bought, including number wall charts, calculators, shapes, money games, clock teaching, weights, timers and various fraction/decimal /percentage/probability games and all staff completed Numicon training.

Further resources have been identified and are being purchased.

## Assessment

All children were reassessed against the WS maths assessment criteria. 10 out of 11 pupils (91%) have made expected or above progress in maths. 1 out of 11 (9%) has not made expected progress but this child however has had a significant amount of absence recorded due to hospitalisation. 4 out of 11 pupils (36%) have made expected progress in maths. 6 out of 11 pupils (54%) have made above expected progress in maths.
